Responsible Bidder Language specifies that construction bids go to the lowest responsible bidder. It acknowledges that price is important but only one factor in deciding. The Illinois Economic Policy Institute captures the essence of responsible bidder language by noting that it is "an acknowledgment that governments should consider benefits in addition to costs. It is a qualifications-based approach that works within the low-bid system to provide the highest possible quality at the lowest possible cost."

In real-world bidding, this translates into municipal officials considering other elements besides cost. They should ask whether the low bidder:

- Complies with environmental, labor and safety mandates.
- Hires within the community while emphasizing women and minority participation.
- Demonstrates how it offers worker training that improves skill levels and implements "safety first" protocols.

The above are valid considerations that every contractor should be willing to answer.
